

# PROACTIVE CHECK IN

We Strive for Clean Rentals - Upon your arrival we ask that you please look around your home to see that everything is in order and the level of cleanliness meets your satisfaction. It is our goal to provide you with the best stay possible, starting within your home. We ask that if the home isn't in good order then please call our Housekeeping Department. If you have not notified us within 24 hours of your arrival, then we assume that you have found your home to be suitable for your stay.

**Reporting Existing Damage** – Please look around your home upon arrival and report any existing damage to us within 24 hours. This will allow us to document that the damages occurred prior to your arrival.

**Linens/Rental Equipment** – All linens are delivered prior to your arrival. If you do not see linens located inside your home, please check the beds before calling our housekeeping line, as some of our homes require beds to be made prior to our guests' arrival. In the event you experience any issues or wish to order more linens, please call our Housekeeping Department.

**Air Conditioning** – Unless the unit appears to be completely nonfunctional, we ask that you please wait 24 hours before reporting any air conditioning problems. During the summer months, please keep the AC unit set at **74 degrees**, no lower. Setting the thermostat at a lower temperature too quickly can cause the unit to freeze up, resulting in having to shut the unit down for a lengthy time period. Please turn unit(s) off while windows and doors are open.

**Refrigerator** – We ask that you please wait 24 hours before reporting any refrigerator issues. Due to the refrigerator being opened during check-in and check-out, for lengthy periods of time, it may take time to return to the normal cool setting. Make sure the refrigerator and freezer are always set to the medium setting. Turning them too high will cause the compressor to freeze. Avoiding excessive opening/closing on your first day will help with the cooling process.

## MAINTENANCE/EMERGENCIES

Maintenance/Refunds — Please promptly report any and all equipment concerns to our Maintenance Department. We will make every effort to have repairs made as soon as possible. Maintenance calls made outside of business hours, of a non-emergency nature, are subject to a \$50 service fee due upon services rendered. NO reduction of rent, rebate or refund will be issued for any mechanical failure of air conditioning, major or minor appliances, public utility interruptions, guest dissatisfaction or for errors in the brochure. In addition, we do not issue refunds due to inclement weather.

After-Hours Emergencies - \*\*VERY IMPORTANT\*\* Our office hours are Monday thru Friday 8:00am - 5:00pm, Saturday 9:00am - 5:00pm and closed on Sunday. Our after-hours emergency service is in place until 10:00pm and is only for dire emergencies that may threaten your life or the property. Air conditioning that is not properly functioning and/or a water leak are what we deem "after-hour" emergencies. Non-emergency calls are subject to a \$50 service fee, due upon services rendered. We greatly appreciate your cooperation and consideration with our after-hour service. Our Maintenance/After-Hour number is (910) 448-1355.

\*Call **911**immediately in the event of a fire or medical emergency\*

**Lock Outs** – We ask that you please always keep both sets of keys with you. If you lock yourself out of your rental after hours, you will incur a \$35 fee expected when a property management employee meets you at the office or a \$45 fee if the keys are to be delivered to your home.

**Clogged Toilet/Sink** – All properties come equipped with a plunger. There should be one located in each bathroom and one under the kitchen sink as well. If this does not solve your problem, then please call our Maintenance Department.

**Stove/Oven** – In the event one of your burners is not functioning properly, try to pull the burner out and replace to make sure the connection is secure. If this still does not fix the issue, please contact our maintenance department. Please do not use the self-clean feature on your oven.

Washer/Dryer – If you encounter a problem with your washer/dryer, many have a troubleshooting guide on the underside of the washer lid. If no instructions are listed, here are a few suggestions: 1) If the washer will not spin after washing a cycle, make sure you do not have too many clothes in the load. 2) If the dryer is taking much longer than it should to dry, try putting in fewer clothes.

3) Keep the lint filter clean to ensure shorter drying times.

# PROACTIVE CHECK OUT

Check Out Procedures – Check-out time is promptly at 10am, NO EXCEPTIONS. Your prompt departure is needed and appreciated to allow our housekeeping team enough time to prepare the rental for the next guests.

Please make sure the following is completed before your departure:

- Return all AC/furnace units to 78 degrees during summer and 55 during winter
- Remove all food from cabinets and refrigerator/freezer
- All trash (kitchen, bathrooms, bedrooms, outdoors) must be placed in receptacles and placed at the curb
- Wash/dry all dishes and place back in original location
- Return ALL furnishings to original position (furniture, pictures, collectables, etc.)
- Turn off all lights, inside and out, including ceiling fans
- \*IMPORTANT\* Make sure to lock ALL windows and doors
- Please be sure to place all keys back in the lock box

Trash Collection (Black Cans) & Recycling (Blue Cans)- \*\*Very Important\*\* We ask that you please remove all trash, inside and out. Trash collection occurs every Tuesday, year-round, and trash receptacles must be out at the street no later than 6am. An additional pick-up occurs on Saturday, from June to September. We ask that you place your receptacle back near the home after collection has occurred. Recycling carts (not all properties participate in this service) are emptied every other week, during the months of October – May and weekly during the months of June – September.

Remove All Provided Bed Linens – Bed sheets and pillow cases should be removed and placed in the bag in which they came in. Please place linen bag directly inside the front door for easy removal. In the event your home was prepared with beds made prior to your arrival, we ask that you kindly take those linens and place them near the washer/dryer or at the foot of the bed.

Security Deposit Refund – Security deposits will be refunded within 45 days of guest departure, assuming there are no damages caused by you. Your security deposit refund will be issued back to your credit card or by check, whichever manner you paid your deposit.

Reservation Holds for the Following Year – Guests have the option to reserve their current vacation home, for the same calendar week of the following year, by placing a \$50 reservation hold. Current guests have until 5pm of the Wednesday during their stay to capitalize on this option. All reservation holds are tentative and subject to price increases, change of amenities and availability.

# VACATION HOME GUIDELINES

Long Distance Calls – A long distance block has been placed on your phone, however, all 1-800 number calls are free.

The Owners' Closet – All homes are equipped with a locked owners' closet or storage room. We ask that you be respectful of these areas as they are not intended for guests. Tampering with these areas will result in a charge to your security deposit.

Grilling/Fireplace – It is strictly prohibited by the fire ordinance of the state of North Carolina to use grilling equipment in multiple unit buildings or on wooden decking. ALL grilling should be done on the ground level of the rental property. All grills must be at least twenty (20) feet from any part of any structure while in use or producing any heat. This includes overhangs of any structure. Never use charcoal in gas grills and please remember it is the guests' responsibility to clean the grills before departure. Please refrain from using fireplaces during summer months or in high wind conditions.

Gatherings/Occupancy – Please respect your neighbors and the home in which you are staying. House parties are strictly prohibited. The number of guests occupying a property is limited to the number stated on the confirmation and exceeding the specified occupancy constituted a breach in the lease agreement and can lead to termination of your stay without refund (except for an infant requiring a crib). These limits are strictly enforced. All homes are limited to families, married couples or adults 24 years of age or older. For groups not meeting these requirements PROACTIVE Vacations will be glad to suggest some resorts in the area to accommodate you. Over occupying a property will result in a 24-hour expedited eviction, without a refund.

**Dishwashers** – Please only use detergent deemed suitable for a dishwasher. Using regular dish soap will produce too many suds and can clog drains, producing an overflow.


Extra Light Bulbs – We are aware that light bulbs go out unexpectedly. In this event, each property should be equipped with extra bulbs in a storage cabinet. If you are unable to find the extra supply or are unable to reach the light that needs changing, please call our housekeeping or maintenance department and they will address the light at their earliest convenience. Any lightbulbs changed are to be left in the cabinet. New bulb inventory is logged. Failure to leave old bulbs will result in a charge of \$5 per new bulb missing from the cabinet.

Carpet/Upholstery – We are aware that accidents happen. If you happen to stain the carpet or upholstery, please do not attempt to remove the stain yourself. Contact our office as soon as possible so that we can plan to fix the issue as soon as possible. If a professional clean is needed, you may be charged for this service.

Pet-Friendly/Dog Only Homes – Pets are allowed at ONLY pet designated properties. A non-refundable pet fee will be required when bringing a pet. A dog friendly home is limited to a single dog or 2 dogs with the combined weight of 50lbs. NC Laws regarding the handicapped are honored. Bringing a dog in a non-pet friendly home will result in the retention of your security deposit to pay for pet damage remediation.

Loss of Personal Property – PROACTIVE Vacations assumes no responsibility for accidents or injuries to guests or for the loss of personal property. It is your job as a guest to make sure your rental home is properly locked upon any and all departures. Open windows should be avoided with the presence of small children. There are no lifeguards present on Holden Beach so please watch your children carefully and be aware of swimming conditions.

**Pools/Hot Tubs** - \*Very Important\*Use pools and hot tubs at your own risk. All pools/hot tubs are cleaned twice a week for the safety and well-being of our guests.





## HOLDEN BEACH RULES

There are NO lifeguards on Holden Beach. Please keep a close eye on your family. If you get caught in a rip current pulling you away from shore, swim parallel to the shoreline until you get out of the current — do not try to swim against the current back to shore.



#### Town of Holden Beach Ordinances

**Beach Strand** – Private motor vehicles and wind powered vehicles of any type are prohibited on the strand. Digging large holes on the beach strand is also prohibited. If deeper than 12 inches, it must be filled before leaving the strand. All tents, umbrellas, volleyball nets and beach furniture must be removed from the beach each day. Any item left out past 6:00pm will be removed and disposed of.

**Fireworks** – Fire is a major threat to our community and accordingly the possession or use of fireworks of any type is strictly prohibited anywhere on the island.

Fires – Open fires are prohibited, except as permitted by law enforcement. Fire in containers manufactured specifically for such purpose (grills, etc.) are allowed in the open and on the ground. Do not use them on your porch or decking.

Alcoholic Beverages - Drinking of wine, beer, whiskey or other alcoholic beverages in any public place is strictly prohibited.

Beach Access – Use designated public or private beach access ways only. Do not cross over private property. Only use walkways and steps to access the beach; crossing dunes can yield a \$500 fine.

**Littering** – The deposit of any waste material or refuse of any kind on the beach strand, along the roadway, in the waterway or on private property is prohibited and punishable by law. Please use garbage receptacles where provided.

Pets – It is unlawful for any pets to be unleashed or otherwise to be a nuisance, especially on the beach strand. It is unlawful for pets to be on the beach strand from 9:00am through 5:00pm from May 20 through September 10.

Surfboards - No surfboard may be used within 500 feet of the fishing pier or of a pavilion.

Noise - Loud or offensive noises, including music, profanity or obscene language, are prohibited.

Fishing – If you fish in the surf, please be courteous to those swimming and relaxing nearby. Fishing with nets along the strand is regulated. Fishing in all coastal waters requires a North Carolina Coastal Recreational Fishing License. Persons desiring to do so should contact Town Hall for information and/or licenses are available from any DMF office, WRC license agents (which includes most Wal-Mart stores), online at WRC's website, www.ncwildlife.org or by calling 888-248-6834.

**Hunting** – Hunting with or without dogs is prohibited.

Jet Skis - Jet skis should only be operated 500 feet from shore. Do not ride jet skis onto the beach strand.

Walkers/Runners/Cyclists – The Town has provided sidewalks the entire length of Ocean Boulevard. For your safety it is requested that you use the sidewalk and stay off the road way. Please be reminded that according to NC State Law all persons under 6 years old MUST wear an approved safety helmet while riding a bicycle.

Aquatic Life Stings – If you are subjected to the unfortunate event of being stung by any of our aquatic life, please call 911. DO NOT attempt to treat it yourself. Our local first responders and emergency medical personnel are trained with the most current treatment methods and will respond promptly. Most of the time they can treat you without the need of hospitalization; this is determined on a case by case basis.





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
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# HAPPY 50<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY HOLDEN BEACH!


- Joseph Holden was born in England around 1639, moved to Cape May, NJ and married Hannah Johnson in 1690. His son, Benjamin Sr. (1692-1717), moved to Brunswick County and married Elizabeth Briggs. When she passed away, he then married Abigail Leonard. Benjamin Jr's son, Jobe Holden (1753-1843), married Sarah Gause in 1777 and they had a son in 1778, William Holden. He married and their son, John Holden Sr. (1815-1880), the father of John Jr., married Charlotte Peterson in 1855. John Holden Jr (1858-1932) married Cornelius Jane Kirby (1856-1939) and had 7 children: Luther Strange, Grover Talmadge, John Herbert, Rebecca Jane, Rothschild H (R.H.), Samuel Edgar (S.E.) and Rhoda Thelma.
- In 1756, Job Holden came from England to New Jersey in search of a southern place. He looked at a North Carolina map and saw the Holden Beach curve. He paid per acre presented as a grant provided by Lord Proprietors through England.
- Off the Holden Beach coast, you can see three shipwrecks from the Civil War era (1861-1865). Ranger, the wrecked blockade steamer, is found in front of where the old Pavilion was; Elizabeth, the Confederate gun runner, is found on a sandbar at the east end of the island; and Bendigo, the Confederate blockade runner, is found aground on a sandbar in the Lockwood's Folly Inlet.
- Jobe Holden passed his land down to his grandson John then to his great-grandson John Holden, Jr. who was married to Cornelia Jane Kirby. He, then, divided the land between his children, Luther, S.E., John Herbert, Grover, R.H., Rhoda and Rebecca Jane. John Holden Jr. built the fisheries, the bridge and the Hotel. Holden Beach's now 8-mile long island is a combination of two pieces of land that were filled in by the Intracoastal Waterway dredging because the dredging was dumped on the beachside, helping to close off the old inlets, Mary's and Bacon's inlets. Prior to, the beach was so wide that there was no real road and planes could land on the widest parts of the beach. Starting west and moving east was: a fishery, Mary's Inlet (where pier is today), the pavilion and the Hotel (in front of where the old ferry was; at the end of now Ferry Road), another fishery and then the east end of Holden Beach, at Lockwood Folly Inlet was once Bacon's Inlet on what was once Robinsons Beach. Luther got the Hotel and the land near it, which he built the store/Pavilion next door. In the 50s, John and Kemp ran the J&K Pavilion where they also had the Post Office. John Herbert got the section at the end of the island and the fishery; he also had a general store at the ferry. Rothchild (R.E.) Holden, making their own cinderblocks, built the Ocean View Tavern in 1949 because there was electricity on the island by 1941. R.H. Holden owned a beach strip from the old ferry road to the west side of the Beach Church. He donated the property for the Church and the first town office. All the other children got the land between the Hotel and Mary's Inlet (where the pier is

## The Old Holden Beach Ferry





- In 1925, John Holden Jr. had a log bridge built across the creek which was the first bridge built to the mainland. John Fulford built a two-story Hotel for him which was the first building on the beach besides John Holden Jr.'s fisheries.
- In the 1930s, the Waterway was widened for boats and barges to be able to pass through with little to no wait, along with the help of the new ferry service, ran by Jesse & Harvey Kirby. This one-car ferry was operated by hand (jack-stick), moving the ferry along a metal cable across the Waterway, from the mainland to the island. John Herbert had a store right at the ferry.
- During WWII (1939-1945), people living on Holden Beach remember the coast guard and government requesting everyone to pull their shades so German submarines couldn't see there was civilization on the island. The Coast Guard built a lookout station west of the Pavilion with stables for their horses and Army planes used to have target practice shooting along the beach strand.
- In 1952, Governor Scott was invited to hear Holden Beach's need for a bridge and had a hand in getting the boulevard paved on the island. The bridge was built just before Hurricane Hazel in 1954.
- In 1954, a used turn-bridge was found in Western NC and put in place.
- In February 1969, Holden Beach's east end and west end was combined and incorporated, with John F.
   Holden being Holden Beach's first mayor. At that time, the west end included Robinson's and Colonial Beaches. There were approximately 300 homes on the island.
- The fishing pier land was donated by RH Holden and the pier was built in the 60s and sold in the 70s to Lonny Small (controller of Campbell College in Buies Creek, NC). Lonny Small's daughter married Gill Bass, the current owner of the pier.
- By 1984 there were over 800 homes on the island due to water being brought to the island by the late 70s.
- Festival by the Sea and Day at the Docks both started in the 80s to attract people to Holden Beach. Festival by the Sea started on the bed of an 18-wheeler truck but since then has grown to take up the area under the high-rise bridge. Day at the Docks used to be held along the Intracoastal Waterway with people being shuttled by boat to docks.
- In 1986, the curving high-rise bridge replaced the old bridge.
- In September 1989, Hurricane Hugo hit Holden Beach destroying the original east end oceanfront and second row homes,
